



Occupational Health & Safety Policy

Scaffold Logistics is committed to providing a safe and healthy workplace for all employees, visitors, contractors and the general public. In addition, the Company recognises its statutory responsibilities as set out within applicable legislation, regulations, and codes of practice, and shall adhere to these responsibilities, and shall:

- 1. Develop an OH&S system to comply with relevant State and Federal legislation and to comply with the requirements of AS/NZS 4801.
- 2. Develop safe systems of work and maintain the Company plant and equipment to a standard where associated hazards are identified, assessed and controlled.
- 3. Inform, instruct and supervise all employees, visitors and contractors relevant to the OHS Systems and procedures of the site.
- 4. Consult with the Company employees, visitors and contractors on OHS issues, including changes to work practices and procedures, and before the introduction or significant modification of new plant and equipment.
- 5. Implement ongoing programs to prevent accidents, including coordinating regular workplace inspections in conjunction with employees.
- 6. Set, implement, measure and consult with employees to communicate the current status towards achievement of the Company's OH&S objectives and performance targets.

Managers and supervisors will fully implement the company safety programs and are responsible for ensuring a safe work environment is provided for all employees under their direct control. Managers and supervisors are also responsible for promptly acting on any OHS concerns or issues they become aware of.

Employees are expected to fulfil their obligations with respect to OHS legislation by fully participating in company safety programs, reporting injuries and incidents and following all safety directions, regulations and procedures.
